

## FUNERAL GUIDELINES (Updated July, 2023)

St. John the Baptist Cathedral Basilica Parish

Guidelines for Funeral Mass and for Funeral Liturgy Outside Mass at the Basilica Cathedral of St. John the Baptist - Revised July, 2023

- The Funeral Home will call the Basilica with a contact number for the family when the family of a deceased parishioner contacts them in order to set the date and time of the Funeral Mass or Funeral Service (Liturgy of the Word without Mass) with the Parish 754-2170
- The Basilica Bereavement ministry will arrange to meet with the bereaved family and will guide the family through the choices of scripture readings and music.
- The Parish priest or his designate (with permission from the Parish priest) will preside at the Funeral Mass or Funeral Service (Liturgy of the Word without Mass) at the Basilica.
- The Funeral Mass or Funeral Service and other Funeral Rites -a Vigil Service, Closing of Casket, Rite of Committal - will be offered to the bereaved family.

## Music for Funerals

- Music is chosen in the same way as at Sunday Mass and the hymns are chosen SOLELY from Catholic Book of Worship III &/or Celebrate in Song. These are the hymn books for which we have a license.
- The Organist and Cantor (trained musicians) are provided by the Basilica Parish. If the family desires an outside singer, he/she may sing an appropriate hymn at the Offertory or another part of the Mass. All parts of the Mass are sung and the Basilica musicians and singers are familiar with this music.

## LIVESTREAMING OF FUNERALS (UPDATED JULY 2023)

• The Basilica Heritage Foundation and not the Parish is solely responsible for Live streaming all events in the Basilica. It requires broadcasting, music, and software copyright licenses, as well as trained technicians.
