INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY – FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE, WEDNESDAY, DEC. 12: It has been customary for the Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council (CCIC) to develop a prayer or reflection piece, in consultation with its Indigenous members, to mark this National Day of Prayer. This year, since the CCIC is undergoing a process of restructuring, the Episcopal members have proposed, and the Permanent Council has agreed, that a simpler approach be taken; namely, that the prayer spoken by Pope Francis at Lac Ste Anne during his penitential pilgrimage to Canada be the text for the 2023 National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples. The text of Pope Francis' prayer, therefore, is now available on the CCCB's website:

Bishops release "Template for Pastors on the Evangelization of Young People in Canada today: Praedica Verbum." This template, titled *Praedica Verbum* ("Preach the Word") and developed by the Episcopal Commission for Doctrine, is intended as a resource for pastors, officially mandated pastoral agents, and others in the Church who work with young people. Focusing on what the Church calls "the initial proclamation of the Gospel," it is intended to provide helpful information on the *how* and *what* of evangelization. The template was developed following consultations with numerous Catholic organizations in Canada engaged in the evangelization of young people.
