# LIVING FAITH FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

MARCH 10, 2024

THE GOSPEL FOR TODAY-- John 3: 14-21



Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. The one who believes in him is not condemned; but the one who does not believe is condemned already, got not having believed in the name of the only-begotten Son of God.

"And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil. For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed. But those who do what is true come to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that their deeds have been done in God."

#### REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL

Some of you might remember seeing signs help up at sporting events and other public gatherings or on billboards that said simply **John 3:16**. Those signs were meant to point people to the Gospel of John, chapter 3, verse 16, hoping that some would look up that reference in the Bible and read the Good News. John 3:16 is indeed good news; in fact, it is the Christian Gospel in a nutshell. And it is part of the gospel reading for the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent in Year B.

Let me repeat it: "God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." The next verse helps to clarify that good news: "Indeed God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world but in order that the world might be saved through him.

- God *loves* God is not indifferent; God is not out to get us; God is not looking to catch us out and punish us. God cares for us and desires only our good and our well-being.
- God loves the **world** God loves everyone, everything, everywhere, all the time.
- God sent Jesus Christ to save the world God sets us free from sin and evil and death and darkness, so we can live in the light.






By immersing us in Christ, Baptism also makes us members of his Body, which is the Church, and sharers in her mission in the world.








