

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Thomas has been known down through the ages as "Doubting Thomas." He was not there when the other Apostles saw the risen Jesus, touched him, and heard him speak to them. He asked for proof that Jesus, who he knew had died, had in fact risen from the dead. He wanted to touch and feel, to be reassured that this was real. In a way, you and I, the modern-day-disciples of Jesus, are like Thomas. We have not seen, but we are called to believe.

To believe does not mean that we never doubt. To believe means to ask questions and seek with a sincere heart and mind for Jesus, for God, for truth, goodness and beauty. It means to trust in the love and mercy of God.

### ASPECTS OF THE SEASON OF EASTER

As far back as the Council of Nicaea (325), the Church reflected Easter joy by prohibiting fasting and kneeling, which are signs of penance, throughout the season. During the Easter season, we stand (rather than kneel) during the Litany of the Saints.

# **Baptismal** Dignity

In a special way, young people, with their gifts and fragilities, growing in friendship with Jesus, become apostles of the Gospel to their peers.
