

### **GLOBAL IRISH FAMINE WAY PROJECT**

On May 10, 2024, in St. John's, Newfoundland, the Basilica Heritage Foundation Inc. and the Embassy of Ireland in Canada will host <u>two events</u> open to the general public at St. John the Baptist Cathedral Basilica Parish to launch the **Global Irish Famine Way Commemorations** and celebrate the arrival of the Bronze Shoe monuments in Canada. The Ambassador of Ireland to Canada, Jamaica, the Bahamas, Antigua and Barbuda (His Excellency, Dr. Eamonn McKee) will speak at both events.

The Global Irish Famine Way Project traces the journey of the 1847 Irish famine emigrants around the world with a series of sites marked by Bronze Shoes and QR codes accessing local information and links to the National Famine Way website in Ireland. Locations will include sites in the UK, Canada, the United States, South Africa and Australia. Further information is available at **bhf.inquiries@thebasilica.net** 

In collaboration with the Marine Institute of Ireland, the cargo of Bronze Shoes will depart on May 1 or 2, 2024, from Galway, Ireland, aboard the RV Celtic Explorer, arriving at St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada, on May 8. At 11 a.m. on the morning of Friday, May 10, 2024, the Bronze Shoes will be brought to the Basilica for a national commemorative event that includes an ecumenical prayer service of thanksgiving for all who gave aid to those who suffered from the Irish Potato Famine in 1847. This will be the first installation in Canada of a pair of Bronze Shoes. All are welcome to attend this event in-person, or to watch the ceremony live at www.thebasilica.net/live/

At 1:30 p.m. on the afternoon of May 10, 2024, the general public is again invited to attend a historical Symposium in the Basilica on the events of 1847 and associated links between Ireland and Canada. This event, also, will be livestreamed at <a href="www.thebasiica.net/live/">www.thebasiica.net/live/</a>. The Bronze Shoes will remain on display for visitors at the Basilica with information panels and associated exhibits. Please join us!

### Message to Catholic Families from the President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops on National Family and Life Week

13 to 19 May 2024

Dear Catholic families,

National Family and Life Week (NFLW) this year will take place from 13 May to 19 May 2024. The theme for this year is "Love hopes all things," which is taken from Saint Paul's hymn on love in 1 Corinthians 13.7: "[Love] bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things." This description of love is also at the heart of Pope Francis's reflection on the dynamics of spousal and family love in the Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation Amoris Laetitia, chapter 4. Through this theme, families are encouraged to cultivate, deepen, and renew Christian hope by drawing on scriptural reflection, family prayer, and the Sacraments.

The CCCB Standing Committee for Family and Life and its corresponding Office have developed a pastoral toolkit specifically designed for the "domestic church." Each day of the NFLW 2024 celebrates a specific theme, accompanied by prayers and activities for different ages, cultures, and circumstances. The toolkit includes: the logo for the 2024 National Family and Life Week; catechesis; prayer intentions and daily activities for families and parishes; graphic resources with quotes on Christian hope for daily social media campaigns; as well as pastoral suggestions for a Mass to celebrate Family and Life.

Dioceses/Eparchies, parishes, and Catholic movements and associations are encouraged to make good use of the pastoral toolkit in their own planning of activities to mark this Week, which concludes on Pentecost.

May the Holy Spirit lead us into a "Love [that] hopes all things" during this Week. May our thoughts, words, and actions be inspired by the same Spirit, and may God hear the prayers of our Catholic families and grant them the hope that only He can give.
